We are proud to announce that 5 students received scholarships to university, including Mary, who received full scholarship to a USA university for medicine.

We provided a couple computers and St Theresa started Loving Compassion Africa.com a circuits club. They competed in a Nairobi school competition and came 3rd, winning 4 more computers for their school. As the first slum school to compete in these competitions, they drew attention from the government. They have been given a STEMs program.



For \$30 - \$50/month provide a child with an education.

LCAS currently sends over 100 children to school, but we have a long list of children waiting for your help.



#### **Goat Project - 2024**

Mothers with Disabled Children cannot leave them alone to find work, but they can raise milk goats at their homes. Goat milk farming can be done on a small scale & will provide food, nutrients and needed funds to the families. This project will empower and enable them to purchase needed medicines, bring them hope, purpose and a way to become self sufficient.

We found one of the top 5 goat farmers in Kenya, who is only 3.5 km away' and he has agreed to train and oversee the project: building enclosure buying, raising, goat health, milking, selling etc Each pregnant goat will cost \$250.
